2025 Removal-Fill Fees

The law requires the Department of State Lands to adjust removal-fill and wetland delineation fees every January 1st based on changes during the previous year in the Consumer Price Index (CPI)*. It does not affect the general authorization fees for certain projects, which remain at \$250. It also does not affect the fee for resubmittal of a wetland delineation report review fee (if the initial fee was paid), which remains at \$100.

The CPI increased by 2.8% over the last reportable period (from the 2nd half of 2023 through the 1st half of 2024). We have applied the increase to the current removal-fill application base and volume fees as well as the delineation review fee and rounded to the nearest dollar. The new fees go into effect January 1, 2025.

For a new removal-fill application, there is a non-refundable base fee and there may be a nonrefundable volume fee depending on the number of cubic yards removed or filled. To determine the fee, take the fee for the volume of removal **or** fill and add it to the base fee listed at the left below (removal volume + removal base, **or** fill volume + fill base) for the appropriate applicant category (private, public, or commercial operator). If the project involves both removal and fill, calculate the fee amount both ways, and then pay the higher amount.

Applicant categories are defined as follows:

"Commercial operator" means any person undertaking a project having financial profit as a goal.

"Private operator" means any person undertaking a project for an exclusively nonincome—producing and nonprofit purpose.

"Public body" means federal, state and local governmental bodies, unless specifically exempted by law, engaged in projects for the purpose of providing free public services.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION—NON-REFUNDABLE APPLICATION FEES AND MAILING YOUR APPLICATION

The non-refundable application fee is required for a complete application, and we encourage you to determine the fee based on the above fee schedule and submit it along with your application. If you wish to pay by credit card, please submit your application and once we set it up in our system, we'll contact you with the file number and payment instructions.

An emergency authorization requires a fee, based on the base and volume fees listed in the above fee schedule. The fee must be submitted within 45 days of the date the emergency authorization is granted.

Erosion-flood repair (necessary to preserve existing facilities and land from flood and high stream flows) or a voluntary habitat restoration project does <u>not</u> require a fee.

Also, a project that qualifies as a "No State Permit" (application that does not require a permit) or is exempt from permit requirements under OAR 141-085-0530 through -0535 does <u>not</u> require a fee.

Fees for multi-year permits may be paid in advance in one-lump sum to cover all years that the permit is to be authorized or shall be paid on an annual basis. If the fees for multi-year permits are paid in advance, no additional fees will be required even if the fee rates increase. Determine the advance multi-year fee as follows: (one-time volume fee, if any) + (number of years X base fee). **Example:** 5-Year Commercial Removal with 1,000 cubic yards volume = \$204 + 5(\$410) = \$2,254. FLAT FEE FOR CERTAIN GA's

There is a flat fee of \$250 for actions that result in moving 50 or more cubic yards of material for the following General Authorizations:

- Temporary Impacts to Non-Tidal Wetlands
- Over-Water Structures Fill and Removal
